Welcome back! I hope you all enjoyed the half-term break.

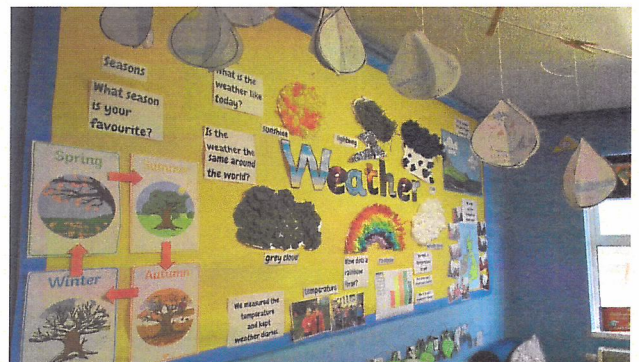

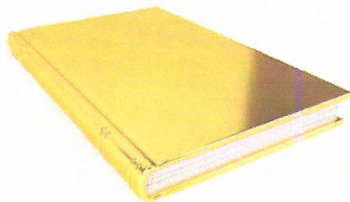
KS1 KS2 website recommendations/reviews

Scratch Jr. - <https://www.scratchjr.org/>

Aimed at children from about the age of 6 or 7, Scratch Jr is a free introduction to coding. It is a 'sandbox' type application where children can make sequences of code by selecting different instructions. It is designed as an introduction to the highly popular 'Scratch' online website which is also free and very powerful - and aimed at older children. Scratch online is also excellent,



but parents should be aware that it does contain a potential social media aspect to it, which children would need to apply their e-safety knowledge to.

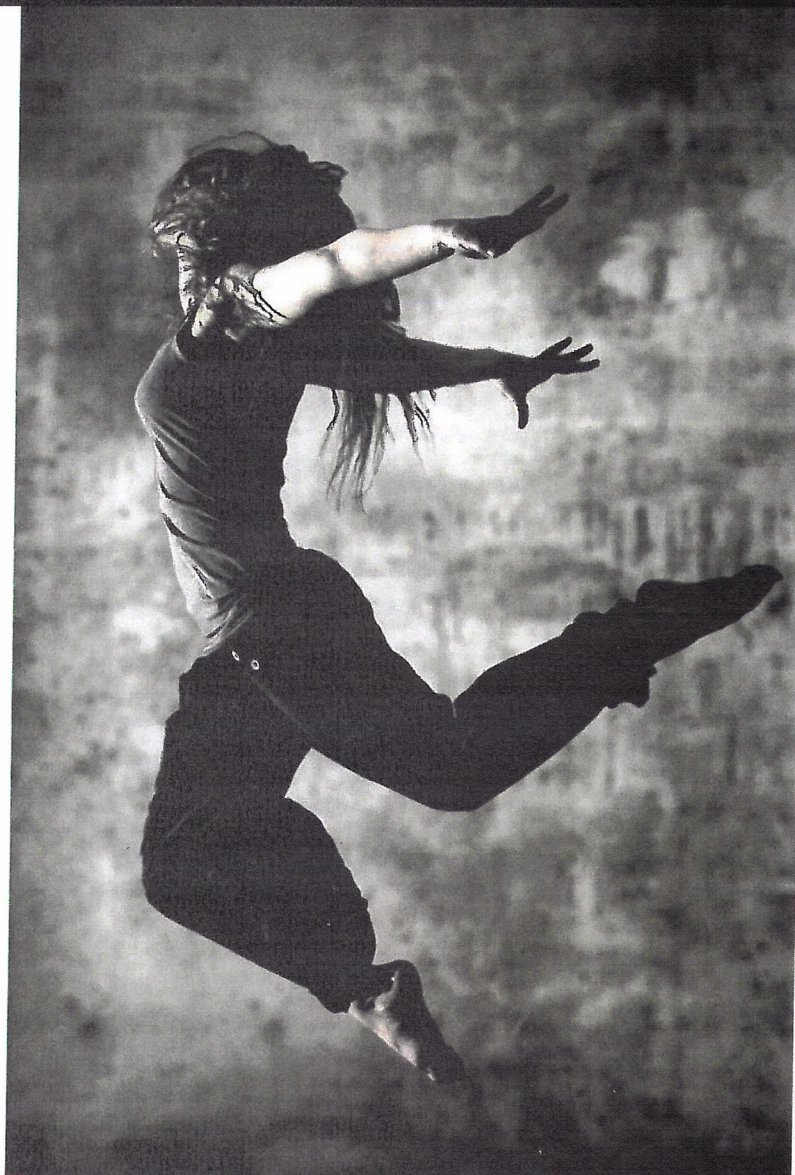

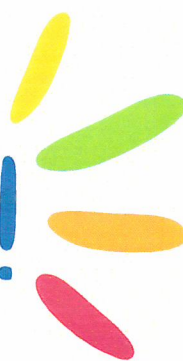
