Last day of term and Covid-19 Christmas holiday contact details

Many of you may will have seen the DfE invitation for schools to close a day early and instead offer children home learning on the last day of term. We have decided not to use this discretionary option here, because we have Christmas events already planned for the children for the last day of term and also because we are mindful of the disruption a late change such as this can have on working parents. I do know that some schools have had to reluctantly close early because of staffing shortages actually caused by childcare issues resulting from this late change- but this is not the case here. School will therefore be open as planned on Friday December 18th.

The rationale behind the DfE change is to support school leaders with Coronavirus contact tracing responsibilities over the Christmas holiday, by effectively reducing by one day the time needed to be available. Here, I will be available by email head@littlemelton.norfolk.sch.uk throughout the Christmas holiday for any Covid-19 related issues that may arise. This is easier to offer as a small school. There is unfortunately the possibility that any positive test results received during the Christmas holiday, dependent on timing, still have an impact on the rest of the bubble - so please inform me so that I can make the necessary arrangements. Clearly, we all have our fingers crossed that this does not happen!




