I really enjoyed learning how to build, I'm going to help dad more to get the garden finished!



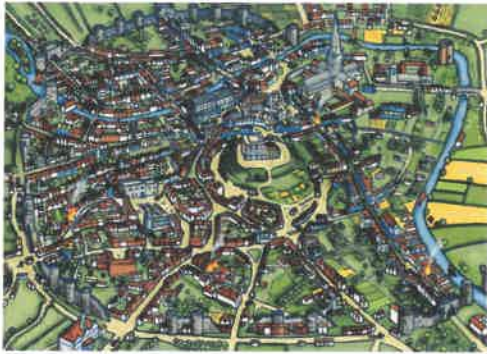
Crocodiles have to have a large space of water in your garden if not they won't survive very long.

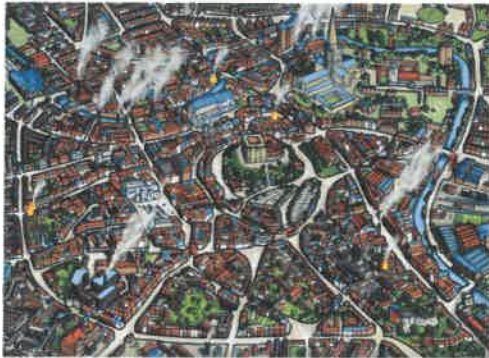
