Many thanks to Mr and Mrs Royle for a very kind donation to support sport and PE in the school. We used it to buy some exciting new equipment—here pictured with Grace!




#### September Arrangements


As you may be aware, the Department for Education guidance for schools has now removed the requirement for restrictive 'bubbles' but does add that schools should ensure that 'outbreak management plans cover the possibility that in some local areas it may become necessary to reintroduce 'bubbles' for a temporary period, to reduce mixing between groups.' With this in mind we plan to go back to our traditional start/end times of 8.45 and 3.15 in September for all classes. Children can all assemble and be collected from the playground. I will write to all parents again if circumstances change before September.

Next term, we hope that we will also be able to welcome parents back into the school again. I was pleased that we were able to invite parents to our recent sports day and Year 6 leavers assembly at least, as a step in this direction. Going forward, we aim to have at least a couple of organised opportunities each half-term for parents to come into school to view their children's work and take part in shared activities with their child, for example craft afternoons and reading café's. We would also hope to be able to return to children mixing freely in whole school events and activity weeks. This includes a return to our traditional transition arrangements by next summer term, with children spending two full mornings with their new class and teachers. I decided not to do this this year because of my concern about the potential impact of one positive case leading to three year groups and associated staff all having to self-isolate and miss end of term activities and summer holidays as a result- particularly in light of the significant recent outbreak at the local academy. I have found that throughout the pandemic we have often had to strike a balance between education and public health considerations, in a context where they could be viewed as working in conflict with each other. We have done our very best to get this balance right and give the children the best provision we could within the restrictions, since their return to school. I have seen lots of happy children's faces in school over the last term, and fortunately minimal disruption, so I believe that we have largely got this right.

As a final note, we have also reflected on whether any of the enforced changes that we have made due to Coronavirus have actually had positive benefits and could usefully continue. We have identified a few areas including:

- we will continue to ask the children to wear PE kit to school on days when they have PE;
- we will continue to allow children to wear trainers or shoes to school,
- we will retain <u>some</u> play and lunchtimes during the week where children play just with their own age group.
- we will continue to hold some separate assemblies each week for Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2
- we will continue to offer Zoom meetings for parents as an addition to face to face appointments where this is helpful to the parents to do so



Following on from our successful Easter holiday scheme we're pleased to announce that our summer holiday scheme for 5-16 year olds is now open for booking. This opportunity is provided as part of the government's Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) programme being delivered across Norfolk by Norfolk County Council in partnership with Active Norfolk.

Please share the flyer provided with any families that you work with that are eligible for means tested free school meals to encourage parents and carers to book their children onto the activities.

Please do encourage families to sign up as soon as possible. The earlier families sign up to the scheme the better so they can get their first choice of activity. Families can access up to 16 days of activities.

Some families may need support with booking and we appreciate any help you can offer to help them to take advantage of this scheme.
