Habitats

A **habitat** is the natural place where something lives.

A **habitat** provides the living thing with everything they need to **survive**
e.g. food, water and shelter.

A **predator** is an animal that hunts and catches another animal to eat it.

Prey is the animal that is hunted or eaten by the predator.

Carnivore - a meat-eater

Herbivore - a plant-eater

Omnivore - an animal that eats meat and plants

Savanna habitat in Africa -

This is like a grassland with some trees.



Desert habitat in Africa -

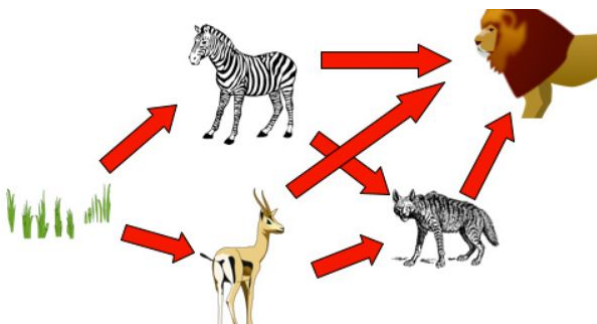
Some animals can survive here but it is very hot in the day, and cold at night.



Food chains

Producer - makes own food e.g. grass

Consumer - eats plants or animals

Continent - a large area of land made up of multiple countries

Country - an area of land with boundaries which fits within a continent

City - the largest kind of settlements and often have millions of people living in them

Rural - a place that is in the countryside

Fairtrade - it means we pay a fair price for the things other people grow or make

Climate - weather conditions in a certain region

Wildlife - animals you would find in a certain place

Landmarks - an object or a feature of a landscape or town that has importance or makes a place easily recognizable
