Science


Minibeasts are small animals with no **backbone** - this makes them **invertebrates**.



Minibeasts live in lots of different **microhabitats** e.g. pond, hedgerow, under a log etc.

Science

Insects (a type of minibeast) have three main parts of their bodies - head, thorax and abdomen.



Caterpillars transform as shown in the diagram here. They go into a cocoon (chrysalis) and then emerge as butterflies!

Geography

Maps are used to help us find our way around places. Someone who draws maps is called a cartographer.

Maps use symbols to represent physical and human features e.g. roads, footpaths, rivers. The symbols are shown in a key.
