#### Dear Parents,

First of all, a big well done to all of the children in Eagle Owls involved in the Dance Showcase event last week. 






















#### School Council News From Around the School

On 30th June plates will go home with children requesting contributions for the cake stall at the fair . Please return to school on 7 July.




Setting Up & Helping on Stalls
